Susan, along with a Christian Education and Sacred Music workshop. Unfortunately, due to various fall fundraisers in different parishes, His Grace decided that we will no longer have our fall meeting in October. He did encourage inter-region retreats and get-togethers to keep the camaraderie in full swing.

Since no one could make it to the Antiochian Village for the meeting, the meeting came to us! A phone conference was held so that anyone could dial in and be a part of the mid-winter meeting.
