# THE SERVICE OF THE LITIA AND ARTOKLASIA GREAT-MARTYR KATHERINE THE ALL-WISE OF ALEXANDRIA & LEAVE-TAKING (APODOSIS) OF ENTRANCE OF THEOTOKOS

## THE DOXASTICA AT THE LITIA PROCESSION IN TONE FIVE

For St. Katherine the Great-Martyr

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Today an exceedingly radiant day and an all-joyous springtime, the prizewinner's most august festival, hath dawned forth unto the ends of the world, illuminating the hearts of the pious, and making the festival fragrant with wonders as with flowers. Come, therefore, all ye faithful, let us be glad in the spirit, and let us clap our hands on the bright and venerable memorial of the Martyr. Let us crown her with garlands of praise, crying thus: Rejoice, O Katherine, thou comely virgin maiden. Rejoice, thou bride of Christ. Rejoice, thou who didst show the rhetoricians' unbridled mouths to be as voiceless as fish, who in the face of an impious king didst convict the foolishness of the Greeks and didst preach Christ, Who granteth us Great Mercy.

## For the Entrance of the Theotokos

Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

A joyful day and an all-solemn feast hath broken forth, for she who before birth-giving was a Virgin, and after birth-giving remained a Virgin, is presented today in the holy Temple. Wherefore, the old Zachariah, father of the Forerunner, rejoiceth and crieth with joy, Behold, she who is the hope of the sorrowful approacheth the Temple; for she is a saint, to be offered as a vow for the abode of the King of all. Let, therefore, Joachim and Anna the grandparents be glad; for they have offered the blameless Lady as a ewe of three years. Wherefore, O ye mothers, rejoice, and ye virgins be joyful, and ye childless women exchange glad tidings; for the queen of all, pre-ordained, hath opened for us the kingdom of heaven; rejoice, O ye nations, and be joyful.

• After the Litia hymns are chanted stichirarically (slowly), and the procession of clergy and altar servers has finished at the solea, the clergy now begin the Service of Litia & Artoklasia.

Deacon: Have mercy upon us, O God, according to Thy great goodness, we pray Thee,

hearken and have mercy.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Deacon: Again we pray for all pious and Orthodox Christians.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Deacon: Again we pray for our father and Metropolitan PHILIP, for our Archbishop

JOSEPH, and all our brotherhood in Christ.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Deacon: Again we pray for every Christian soul, afflicted and weary, in need of God's

mercies and help; for the protection of this holy house and those who sing therein and the people here present; for the peace and stability of the whole world; for the

good estate of the holy churches of God; for the salvation and help of our fathers and brethren who with diligence and fear of God labor and serve; for those who are gone away and those who are abroad; for those who travel by sea, land and air; for the healing of those who lie in infirmity; for the deliverance of captives; for those imprisoned and in danger; for our brethren who are serving and who are remembered for their labor, and for all who await the mercies of God, let us say.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Deacon: Again we pray for mercy, life, peace, health, salvation and visitation and pardon

and forgiveness of sins for the servants of God, the parishioners, members of the parish council and organizations, donors and benefactors of this holy temple and

those here present who celebrate this holy feast.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Deacon: Again we pray that He may keep this holy church and this city and every city and

countryside from wrath, famine, plague, earthquake, flood, fire, the sword, foreign invasion, civil war and sudden death; that our good God, Who lovest mankind, will be gracious, favorable and conciliatory and turn away and dispel all the wrath stirred up against us and all sickness, and may deliver us from His

righteous chastisement which impendeth on us, and have mercy upon us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (FORTY TIMES)

Deacon: Again we pray that the Lord our God may hearken unto the voice of the

supplication of us sinners, and have mercy upon us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (THRICE)

Priest: Hear us, O God our Savior, the Hope of all the ends of the earth and of those who

are far off upon the sea; and be gracious, be gracious, O Master, upon our sins, and have mercy upon us. For Thou art a merciful God and lovest mankind, and unto Thee do we ascribe glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy

Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

THE PEACE

Priest: Peace be to all.

Choir: And to thy spirit.

Deacon: Let us bow our heads unto the Lord.

Choir: To Thee, O Lord.

Priest: O Master, great in mercy, Lord Jesus Christ our God, through the intercessions of our all-immaculate Lady Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary—whose Entrance into the Holy of Holies we now celebrate—by the might of the precious and life-giving Cross; by the protection of the honorable Bodiless Powers of Heaven; at the supplications of the honorable, glorious Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John; of the holy, glorious, all-laudable apostles Peter and Paul, and of all the holy apostles; of our fathers among the saints, great hierarchs and ecumenical teachers, Basil

the Great, Gregory the Theologian and John Chrysostom; of our fathers among the saints, Athanasios, Cyril and John the Merciful, patriarchs of Alexandria; Nicholas of Myra, Spyridon of Trimythous and Nektarios of Pentapolis, the Wonderworkers; Nicholai of Zhicha, who labored in America, Innocent, Evangelizer of Alaska and Enlightener of North America, John, Wonderworker of Shanghai and San Francisco, and Raphael, bishop of Brooklyn; of the holy, glorious, great-martyrs, George the Trophy-bearer, Demetrios the Myrrh-streamer, Theodore the Soldier, Theodore the General, and Menas the Wonderworker; of the hieromartyrs Ignatios the God-bearer of Antioch, Charalampos and Eleutherios, Tikhon, patriarch of Moscow and Enlightener of North America, Juvenaly of Iliamna, and the martyr Peter the Aleut; of the holy, glorious great women martyrs, Thekla, Barbara, Anastasia, Katherine—whose memory we now celebrate—Kyriaki, Photeini, Marina, Paraskeva and Irene; of the holy, glorious, right-victorious martyrs; of our venerable and God-bearing fathers who shone in the ascetic life, Anthony the Great, Seraphim of Sarov, and Herman of Alaska; of Saint N., the patron and protector of this holy community; of the holy and righteous ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna, and of all Thy saints:

Choir: Amen.

Priest: Grant us forgiveness of our trespasses;

Choir: Amen.

Priest: Shelter us under the shelter of Thy wings;

Priest: Drive away from us every enemy and adversary;

Choir: Amen.

Priest: O Lord, have mercy on us and on Thy world and save our souls, for Thou art a

merciful God and lovest mankind.

Choir: Amen.

THE ARTOKLASIA

This Theotokion is sung in Tone Five.

Clergy: Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, Mary full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed

art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb;

Choir: For thou hast borne the Savior of our souls.

Deacon: Let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Priest: O Lord Jesus Christ our God, Who didst bless the five loaves in the wilderness

and didst satisfy the five thousand therewith, Thyself bless these loaves, this wheat, wine and oil, and multiply them in this city, in the houses of those who

celebrate this feast and in all thy world, and sanctify the faithful who partake of them. For it is Thou Who dost bless and sanctify all things, O Christ our God, and unto Thee do we ascribe glory, together with Thine unoriginate Father and Thine all-holy, good and life-giving Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

## TROPARION IN TONE SEVEN

The clergy sing this Troparion once, and then the choir sings it twice.

Rich men have turned poor and gone hungry; but they that seek the Lord shall not be deprived of any good thing. (THRICE)

• Great Vespers resumes with the Aposticha.

• The following Great Dismissal is used at Great Vespers when the Litya and Artoklasia are served. The usual one is not said. This follows the Apolytikia.

Choir: Amen.

Priest: Glory to Thee, O Christ our God and our Hope, glory to Thee.

Choir: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; both now and ever, and

unto ages of ages. Amen. Lord, have mercy (thrice). Father, bless.

Priest: May Christ our true God, through the intercessions of His all-immaculate and all-blameless holy Mother—whose Entrance into the Holy of Holies we now celebrate—by the might of the Precious and Life-giving Cross; by the protection of the honorable Bodiless Powers of Heaven; at the supplication of the honorable, glorious Prophet, Forerunner and Baptist John; of the holy, glorious and all-laudable apostles; of the holy, glorious and right-victorious Martyrs; of our venerable and God-bearing Fathers; of Saint N., the patron and protector of this holy community; of the holy and righteous ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna; of the holy and glorious Great-martyrs Katherine the all-wise of Alexandria and Mercurios of Caesarea in Cappadocia; and Martyr Mercurios of Smolensk, whose memory we celebrate today, and of all the saints: have mercy on us and save us, forasmuch as He is good and loveth mankind.

Priest: Through the prayers of our Holy Fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy

upon us and save us.

Choir: Amen.

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
