the saints, great hierarchs and ecumenical teachers Basil the Great, Gregory the Theologian and John Chrysostom; Athanasius, Cyril and John the Merciful, patriarchs of Alexandria; Nicholas of Myra, Spyridon of Trimythous and Nektarios of Pentapolis, the Wonderworkers; of our fathers among the saints Tikhon, patriarch of Moscow and Raphael, bishop of Brooklyn; of the holy, glorious, great-martyrs, George the Trophy-bearer, Demetrios the Myrrh-streamer, Theodore the Soldier, Theodore the General, and Menas the Wonderworker; of the hieromartyrs Ignatius the God-bearer of Antioch, Charalampos and Eleutherios; of the holy, glorious great women martyrs, Thekla, Barbara, Anastasia, Katherine, Kyriaki, Photeini, Marina, Paraskeva and Irene; of the holy, glorious, right-victorious martyrs; of our venerable and God-bearing fathers who shone in the ascetic life; (*of Saint N., the patron and protector of this holy community*); of the holy and righteous ancestors of God, Joachim and Anna; of the holy, glorious, and all-laudable Apostle Thomas, called “The Twin”; of the holy, glorious all-laudable Apostle and Evangelist Mark; Macedonios, patriarch of Constantinople; and Martyr Nike, disciple of St. George, whose memory we celebrate today, and of all the saints: we beseech Thee, O most merciful Lord, hearken unto the petitions of us sinners who make our supplications unto Thee, and have mercy upon us.

Choir: Lord, have mercy. (*Twelve times*)

Priest: Through the mercies and compassions and love for mankind of Thine Only-begotten Son, with Whom Thou art blessed, together with Thine all-holy, and good, and life-giving Spirit: now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

#### KONTAKION AND OIKOS FOR ST. MARK (Plain Reading)

When thou hadst received the Spirit’s grace from Heaven’s heights, thou rentest apart the webs of philosophers; and on catching all of the nations in thy net, O all-lauded Mark, thou didst offer them to thy Lord, by preaching the Gospel of divine renown.

When thou becamest a disciple of the Chief Apostle, and with him didst preach Christ as the Son of God, thou madest steadfast on the rock of truth them that were storm-tossed with error. On this rock make me steadfast also, and guide the steps of my soul aright; that, being delivered from the snares of the enemy, I may glorify thee without hindrance. For thou hast enlightened all men, O wise Mark, by preaching the Gospel of divine renown.

#### THE SYNAXARION (Plain Reading)

On this day, the Tuesday of Thomas Week, we continue to celebrate Christ’s Resurrection, and the occasion whereon the Holy Apostle Thomas touched the Savior’s side.

On April 25 in the Holy Orthodox Church, we commemorate the holy Apostle and Evangelist Mark.

#### *Verses*

When blood-stained men dragged Mark on the earth to slay him,  
They unwittingly sent him to Heaven.

On the twenty-fifth, senseless men drew a Mark upon the ground.

Mark was a traveling companion and assistant to the Apostle Peter. While Mark was in Rome with Peter, the faithful begged him to write down for them the saving teaching of the Lord Jesus, His miracles and His life. Thus, Mark wrote the first Holy Gospel which the Apostle Peter himself saw and attested to its truthfulness. Mark was appointed a bishop by the Apostle Peter and was

sent to Alexandria, Egypt. When the heathens raised accusations against Mark, as a destroyer of their idolatrous faith, he fled to Pentapolis where he continued to strengthen his earlier work. After two years, Mark again returned to Alexandria to the great joy of all the faithful, whose number was greatly multiplied. However, on this occasion, the pagans seized Mark, and he was martyred. His soul was translated into a better world.

On this day, we also commemorate Macedonios, patriarch of Constantinople; and Martyr Nike, disciple of St. George. By the intercessions of Thy saints, O God, have mercy on us. Amen.

#### KATAVASIAS OF THE PASCHAL CANON IN TONE ONE

**Ode 1.** Today is the Day of Resurrection! O nations, let us shine forth; for the Pascha is the Pascha of the Lord, in that Christ did make us pass from death to life, and from earth to heaven, who now sing the song of victory and triumph.

**Ode 3.** Come, let us drink a new drink, not wondrously produced from a barren rock, but from the fount of incorruption, that hath come to us with the overflowing of Christ from the tomb, in Whom we are strengthened.

**Ode 4.** Upon the divine watchtower let the God-spoken Habakkuk stand and show us the angel attired in light, saying openly: Today is salvation to the world; for Christ is risen, Almighty as He is.

**Ode 5.** Let us rise early at morn, at the break of dawn, and let us instead of fragrant ointment bring pure praise to the Master. Let us behold Christ Who is the Son of righteousness bringing life unto all.

**Ode 6.** O Christ, into the deepest abyss of earth Thou didst descend, and didst break the unyielding everlasting bars which held men prisoner; and on the third day Thou didst rise from the tomb as Jonah from the whale.

**Ode 7.** He Who did save the children from the furnace, when He became Man, suffered like unto a mortal, and with His sufferings invested the mortal with the beauty of incorruption, Who is the God of our Fathers. To Him alone be blessing and glory.

*We praise, we bless, and we worship the Lord.*

**Ode 8.** Verily, this day, which is called holy, is the first day among sabbaths, their King and Lord. It is the feast of feasts, the season of seasons, in which we bless Christ for evermore.

Deacon: The Theotokos and Mother of the Light let us honor and magnify in song.

#### MAGNIFICATIONS IN TONE ONE

Choir: My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior.

*Refrain:* More honorable than the Cherubim, and more glorious beyond compare than the Seraphim, thou who without corruption barest God the Word, and art truly Theotokos, we magnify thee. *(Repeat after each Verse.)*

+ For He hath regarded the lowliness of His handmaiden; for behold from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. *(Refrain)*

+ For He that is mighty hath magnified me, and holy is His Name; and His mercy is on them that fear Him, throughout all generations. *(Refrain)*

+ He hath showed strength with His arm; He hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. *(Refrain)*

- + He hath put down the mighty from their seat, and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the empty with good things, and the rich hath He sent empty away. (*Refrain*)
- + He remembering His mercy hath helped His servant Israel, as He promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed forever. (*Refrain*)

THE NINTH KATAVASIA OF THE PASCHAL CANON IN TONE ONE

*The angel spake to her that is full of grace, saying: O pure Virgin, rejoice; and I say also: rejoice; for thy Son is risen from the tomb on the third day.*

Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem; for the glory of the Lord hath risen upon thee. Rejoice and exult now, O Zion, and thou, O pure one, Theotokos, rejoice at the Resurrection of thy Son.

THE LITTLE LITANY

Deacon: Again and again, in peace, let us pray to the Lord.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Help us; save us; have mercy on us; and keep us, O God, by Thy grace.

Choir: Lord, have mercy.

Deacon: Calling to remembrance our all-holy, immaculate, most-blessed and glorious Lady Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, with all the saints: let us commend ourselves and each other, and all our life unto Christ our God.

Choir: To Thee, O Lord.

Priest: For all the powers of Heaven praise Thee, and unto Thee do they ascribe glory: to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and ever, and unto ages of ages.

Choir: Amen.

EXAPOSTEILARIA FOR THOMAS SUNDAY AND ST. MARK IN TONE THREE

(\*\**Thou Who, as God, adornest*\*\*)

O Thomas, thou hast searched out \* My wounded limbs with thine own hand; \* doubt not of Me Who was wounded \* for thee, but have a single mind \* with the disciples, and preach Me, \* the Living God, to all mankind.

(\*\**O changeless Light*\*\*)

Thou wast made rich with the sonship \* of Peter, the Chief Apostle; \* O blessed Mark, for this reason, \* thou wast the first out of all men \* to set forth for the Egyptians \* the Holy Gospel, \* wherewith thou lightest the whole world.

(\*\**Thou Who, as God, adornest*\*\*)

On this day spring is fragrant; \* the new creation danceth now; \* today the bars have been taken \* off of the doors of disbelief, \* as the friend Thomas doth cry out: \* Thou art my Lord and God truly.

AINOI (PRAISES) IN TONE ONE

Choir: Let everything that hath breath, praise the Lord. Praise ye the Lord from the heavens: praise Him in the heights. To Thee, O God, is due our song.

Choir: Praise ye Him, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. To Thee, O God, is due our song.

For St. Mark in Tone One (\*\**O all-lauded Martyrs*\*\*)

*Verse 1. Praise God in His sanctuary; praise Him in the firmament of His power. Praise Him for His mighty acts; praise Him according to His excellent greatness.*

Let Mark, that most excellent of men, \* be extolled by us with songs and with divine hymns as Egypt's fair and brightly shining light, \* as the all-wise preacher \* of the Father's Son and Word, \* and also the divine author of the Holy Gospel of the Lord; \* for he intercedeth with Christ God \* that He grant peace and Great Mercy to our souls.

*Verse 2. Praise Him with the sound of the trumpet; praise Him with the psaltery and harp.*

Let Mark, that most excellent of men ... (*repeat above*)

*Verse 3. Praise Him with the timbrel and dance; praise Him with stringed instruments and organs.*

The teachings concerning Christ our God, \* His most wondrous Incarnation, His divine Passion, and His Resurrection from the dead, \* and august Ascension \* to His Father in the heights, \* didst thou, O wise Apostle Mark, record, thereby enlight'ning all the earth; \* and by preaching all these things thou hast \* drawn the nations \* to the knowledge of the truth.

*Verse 4. Praise Him upon the loud cymbals: praise Him upon the high-sounding cymbals. Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord.*

O all-wise Apostle of the Lord, \* and obedient disciple of divine Peter wast thou, as obeying all he taught; \* hence, thou didst enlighten \* by the Holy Spirit's grace \* the peoples of the earth and the minds of the Egyptians with thy light; \* and their city, Alexandria, \* O blessed Mark, thou \* didst adorn resplendently.

#### THE DOXASTICON FOR ST. MARK IN TONE SIX

*Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.*

O all-wise fisherman, holy disciple, laborer of the Savior, O Evangelist Mark, who hast blazoned abroad the Lord's sufferings, and by faith hast run throughout creation, gathering in the nations out of error, and offering them unto God as fair incense: thou hast been taken up into Heaven. Wherefore, as thou standest before the Judge, intercede that we be saved from our iniquities, and that on the Day of Judgment we be delivered from torment.

#### THE DOXASTICON FOR THOMAS TUESDAY IN TONE SIX

*Both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.*

Thou didst come to Thy Disciples, O Christ, the doors being shut, but through design Thou didst not find Thomas with them; for he said: I will not believe until I behold the Master, view the side from which blood and water issued for baptism, observe the wound through which He healed man from the great wound, and see that He is not a ghost, but of body and bones. Wherefore, O Thou Who didst tread down death and convince Thomas, O Lord, glory to Thee.

#### APOLYTIKION FOR THOMAS SUNDAY IN TONE SEVEN

While the tomb was sealed, Thou didst shine forth from it, O Life; and while the doors were closed, Thou didst come in to Thy Disciples, O Christ God, Resurrection of all, renewing in us through them an upright spirit, according to the greatness of Thy mercy.

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
